I extend sincere congratulations to the faithful few who have made this yearbook a success.

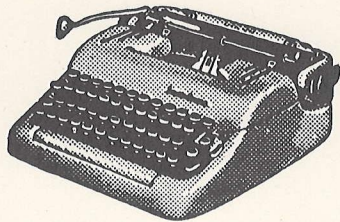
